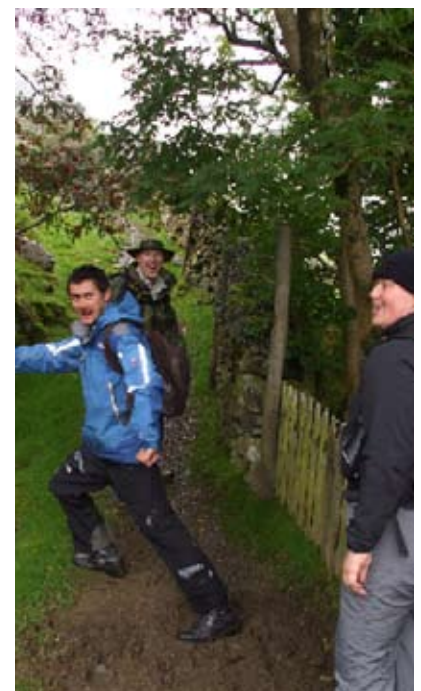

# More on Payez Mobile



**T**he AEPM (Association Européenne Payez Mobile) was set up in 2008 to “promote and accelerate the deployment of contactless mobile payment in Europe” through the development and publication of supporting specifications, published in three “sets”: Set 1 is freely available from the website and covers the functional and technical aspects. Set 2 (security guidelines and configurations) and Set 3 (specifics for Visa and MasterCard implementations) are available under license.

The Association comprises 11 group members (all French) including 4 mobile operators and 7 banks (only operators or banks may join) and has ambitions for its specifications to be adopted more widely across Europe.

This is one of the first comprehensive applications of the various building-blocks for mobile NFC payments, and defines that the Secure Element resides in the SIM (or “UICC”). It builds on ETSI SCP specifications, including the Single Wire Protocol and Host Controller Interface, and the latest GlobalPlatform Card and UICC Configuration specifications. It also cites EMVCo specifications, underpinning its support for Visa, MasterCard et al.

These specifications tackle potential usability problems of mobile NFC payments through the adoption of GlobalPlatform concepts. Application priority and selection issues are addressed using the Contactless Registry Service (CRS) which, together with the Contactless Registry Event Listener (CREL), implements Payez Mobile’s logic of allowing only one application to be active on the contactless interface at any time.

## **“Promote and accelerate the deployment of contactless mobile payment in Europe”**

The concept of a companion application to a payment application is introduced, whereby the companion provides the interface to the payment application from the outside world. Seemingly, this is to allow existing Visa and MasterCard contactless payment applications to work with Payez Mobile, limiting the effort required for re-work and re-certification.

Another interesting aspect is the architecture models for provisioning and management and how these map onto the evolving view of what a Trusted Service Manager (TSM) is. The GSMA model for mobile payments sees a single TSM acting between a bank and an operator. The AEPM architectures break out the range of possible TSM responsibilities into several roles, split across bank and operator domains, enabling “multi-TSM” implementations. This is a more pragmatic option than the single TSM model.

Looking ahead, it will be interesting to see if the companion application model survives, or if payment schemes will close the gaps between their existing payment application specifications and what is required to make mobile NFC payments work. It will also prove of interest to see whether the AEPM specifications manage to break out of France.
